



Year 3 Geography - Autumn Term 1: Our Planet, Our World



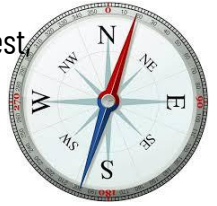
1. Countries are located within **continents**. Countries have capital cities and geographical features. **Latitude** is the distance north or south of the **equator** and **longitude** is the distance east or west of the Prime Meridian.



2. **Physical features** include beaches, cliffs and mountains. **Human features** include houses, factories and train stations.



3. The **eight** points of a **compass** are north, south, east, west, north-east, north-west, south-east and south-west.



4. **Europe** is a **continent** in the Northern Hemisphere. It has over 50 countries

5. **Settlements** can be in **rural** or **urban** areas. In order of size they are called: **hamlet, village, town and city**. Cities have a central business district surrounded by residential areas called **suburbs**. These are all located in counties which are ruled by local government.



6. All settlements have **services**: banks, post offices, hospitals, public transport and garages. **Land use** types include leisure, housing, industry, transport and agriculture. **Geographical evidence** is gathered from **primary data**, which is collected from surveys and observations.
