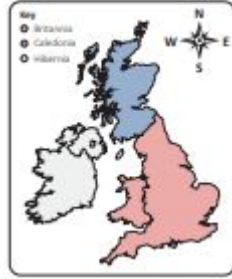




Year 3 History - Summer Term 2: Emperors and Empires

2. Romans built **forts** along the borders of the Roman Empire to help defend it. **Hadrian's Wall** was built to defend themselves from the Caledonians



4. The Romans built **roads** to link up Roman towns and so that the army could move around easily. They were well built from concrete, stone, broken tiles and gravel and were straight. Bridges were built when rivers needed to be crossed.
