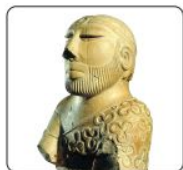


- 1.** A figure drawing is a drawing of the human form in any posture using any drawing media.



- 2.** A statue is a carved or cast figure of a person or animal. A statuette or figurine is a smaller sized statue, especially one that is smaller than life-size.

- 3.** Historical works of art are significant because they give the viewer clues about the past through the symbolism, colours and materials used.

- 4.** Techniques used to create a 3-D form from clay include coiling, pinching, slab construction and sculpting

- 5.** Statues, statuettes and figurines were a significant part of life in ancient Sumer. Male heads are frequently shown bald but sometimes with beards, while female figures had varied hairstyles or headdresses
