4. Significant physical features of the UK include mountains, rivers, islands, lakes and forests. Examples include the River Severn, River Thames, Ben Nevis and Snowdon

2. The Tropic of Cancer is 23 degrees north of the equator and Tropic of Capricorn is 23 degrees south of the equator.
